


# **Amtrak Intercity Trains**

### Passenger Rail Returns to Normal

Since Virginia joined Amtrak as one of their partner states in 2009, our entire Amtrak intercity passenger rail network has continued to grow and thrive. However, the global pandemic caused service disruptions on many of our trains which led to reduced ridership. After two down years, ridership returned to normal in FY 2022 and is primed to grow even further in FY 2023.

Virginia is served by sixteen Virginia Amtrak Regional trains (eight northbound and eight southbound) including our four Regional trains operating on the <u>DC-Newport News</u> corridor, six operating on the <u>DC-Norfolk</u> corridor, two operating on the <u>DC-Richmond</u> corridor, and four operating on the <u>DC-Roanoke</u> corridor; and twelve Amtrak National trains which are the Auto-train, Cardinal, Crescent, Silver Star, Silver Meteor, and Palmetto. Lastly, we're served by two Southeast Amtrak Regional trains in the form of the North Carolina Carolinian service. Our trains serve 21 stations across the Commonwealth, as well as two bus-to-rail stops (Blacksburg and Virginia Beach). Nine of our stations are in the top 100 largest stations (out of 511 total stations) by passenger volume in Amtrak's entire network.
